In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ² the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. ³ Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light.

for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God.

Romans 8:20-22

Every day we wake up and we think that we are living in a dream, and things will return to our habits of comfort very soon. We will feel free to come out of our houses and enjoy shopping, going to restaurants and walks around town. We dream of feeling free to call up friends and say, "Let's go out tonight." In other words, we wake up to the dream that we will get back to living. But then we are confronted with the reality that creation has put its foot down and said, "I am taking over for a while and you must find a way to work with me to get back to living." This is something that we are not use to. Humbling ourselves to creations power and will is a foreign desire. We have felt for years, even with climate change, that we are in control. God has set creation before us, as our home and our privilege to be its gardener. But then, as history has shown, we have been mischievous children, who think we can abuse without consequence. Fighting this virus is now the common goal of the world's communities. Unless we fight this together our partnership will be shattered. We will have failed our neighbor, our friend and God. Stay hopeful and stay steadfast in our quest to heal creation.
